Position Title: Para Educator

Reports To: Education Department Coordinator

Job Summary: Provides assistance to the Early Childhood Special Education Teacher in planning and implementing educational preschool services for children, birth to three years old with special needs.

Essential Functions:

- 1. Performs Para-Educator Tasks:
 - Provides timely and accurate set-up for planned classroom activities
 - Assists in planning and implementing curriculum/activities
 - Assists in obtaining child observation data
 - Performs routine class maintenance tasks
 - Assists in maintaining inventory of equipment and materials
 - Is respectful of parents and children responds to them honestly, refers to Teacher as appropriate
 - Maintains confidentiality
- 2. Performs all cleaning tasks
 - Utilizes universal precautions at all times
 - Cleans and puts toys away properly

Other Functions:

- 1. Employee is dependable and takes initiative in job duties
- 2. Employee communicates effectively with co-workers and consumers
- 3. Employee attends to accuracy and thoroughness of paperwork
- 4. Employee knows the Agency Mission and is Mission oriented

- Infant toddler/early childhood special education experience preferred
- CPR certified
