Walks or stroller/wagon rides around your neighborhood are a wonderful and safe way to get exercise and fresh air! Use this bingo card with your child during your outing to encourage cognitive and language development.

Tips:

- Show your child the pictures, read the label, ask if they see anything on the card
- If you see something, point it out to your child, children learn through repetition, so use simple language like "Look! A black cat. Do you see it? The cat?"
- Use sound effects to have more fun, meow like a cat, tweet like a bird
- Have your child pick up, touch, or hold items like flowers or leaves
- Talk about senses: what do you see, feel, hear, smell? (Wind, cold, cars, flowers, animals, etc.)

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
